Much of the work done by Council Rangers results from community requests. To find solutions, our Rangers need to ensure a balance with law enforcement to keep people safe, with what our community expects.

The Ranger team works a rotating roster from early mornings to late evenings including public holidays, and are also on call to ensure that the Ballina Shire is served 24-hours a day.
