Boardwalk construction

The construction of the Wardell boardwalk has recommenced. The project comprises the construction of a 3 metre wide timber boardwalk along Bridge Drive, Wardell between the existing village jetty and towards the Pacific Highway overbridge.

The boardwalk will be approximately 70 metres long, and will be built along the section of Bridge Drive where there is very narrow river bank edge. The boardwalk will provide pedestrian access along this very narrow river bank edge.

>>> Construction period

The boardwalk construction will be undertaken by contractors, Bell Rock Marine, and recommenced 1 March 2017 with completion scheduled for mid-May 2017.

Access for motorists on Bridge Drive

The contractor will have the work site fenced along the river bank edge, being the south side of Bridge Drive, between the village jetty and the highway overbridge.

Bridge Drive will mostly continue to operate as normal, however there will be times when trucks and deliveries will need to temporarily park next to the job-site along Bridge Drive.

At these times traffic control will be in place and restricted to one lane of traffic, and delays will be experienced.



Access restrictions to river

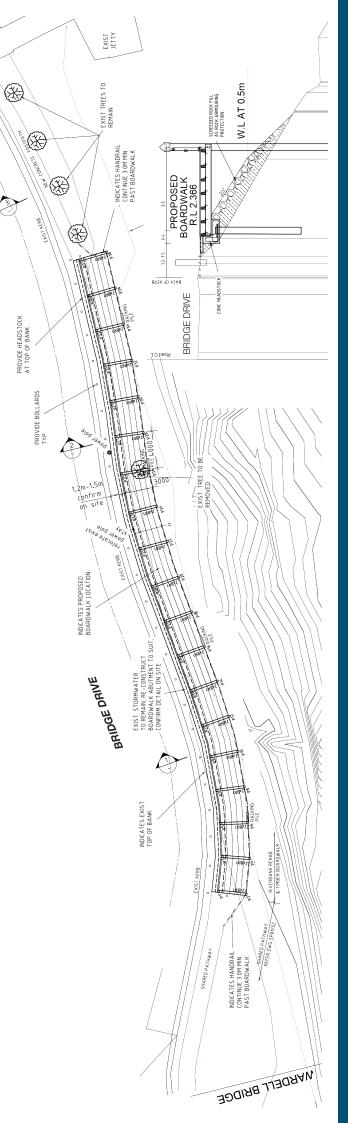
