Rewards program is one way of showing your loyalty to our businesses. Supporting local businesses is vital, particularly with the Ballina Bypass expected to be completed in December this year. If we shop local and buy local we are investing in our economy and employment.

Work to repair The Coast Road at Lennox Head continues and we are hoping it will reopen in early 2012. This of course is dependent on the weather. Whilst we regret the closure of the road over the Christmas holiday period, we need to get the repairs completed as soon as possible; particularly given it took so long for geotechnical studies and reports to be completed and RTA approvals to be issued.

I am pleased to see Regional Express (REX) has started a daily service between Ballina and Newcastle. This is great news for the Northern Rivers and I congratulate REX on its decision. I am sure this will have a very positive impact on our tourism industry.

Work on the Ballina to Lennox Head coastal walk and shared path project continues, with consultants now undertaking the concept designs and environmental assessments for the two routes. The shared path will cater for cyclists and pedestrians and be built on the western side of The Coast Road, linking up with Headlands Estate and then proceeding along Skennars Head Road and North Creek Road, eventually ending at Williams Reserve.

The coastal walk will be east of The Coast Road from Flat Rock to Boulder Beach and Lennox Point.

The summer surf season is well underway and I urge everyone to swim between the flags and on patrolled beaches. Many thanks to our surf lifesavers who do a magnificent job.

PROJECT UPDATES

Ballina to Lennox Head shared path and coastal walk

Council has engaged consultants to undertake the concept design and environmental assessments for the two preferred routes. The shared path project, which will be a shared use facility for both pedestrians and cyclists, will be located west of The Coast Road and connect Angels Beach subdivision with Headlands Estate; and then follow Skennars Head Road and North Creek Road. Ultimately it will also cross over The Coast Road at the intersection with

Skennars Head Road and then follow the eastern side of The Coast Road to Pat Morton Lookout.

The coastal walk will be east of The Coast Road and will formalise a path along the headlands.

It is anticipated that preliminary reporting on both projects will be available by the end of the year.



The early stages of the Ballina town centre upgrade were completed a number of years ago and included the upgrade



of Fawcett Park and River Street between Moon St and Cherry St. Next year it is proposed that work will commence on completing the ends of Moon St and Cherry St. Currently the designs are being reviewed and procurement assessments being undertaken.

Ballina Lighthouse and Lismore Surf Life Saving Club Complex

The new development application for the Surf Club is expected to be lodged with Council by the end of November 2011. Subject to gaining development consent, it is anticipated that construction of the complex will commence in the first half of 2012.



2012/2013 FESTIVAL AND EVENT SUPPORT FUNDING PROGRAM TO OPEN IN DECEMBER

The Triple Zero (000) service is the quickest way to get the right emergency service to help you.



It should be used to contact Police, Fire or Ambulance services in life-threatening or emergency situations.

Triple Zero (000) calls are free and can be made from mobile phones, landlines or pay phones.

Callers with hearing or speech impairments can call the one zero six (106) text-based emergency call service using a text phone.





SCORES ON DOORS

CALLING BUSINESSES TO PARTICIPATE

Ballina Shire Council is taking part in a 12-month trial called 'Scores on Doors' which is part of the NSW Government's strategy to improve food safety in the retail food sector.

The Council is now looking for businesses to join the Scores on Doors trial. It offers businesses a fantastic opportunity to show customers how seriously they take food hygiene.

Certificates from the voluntary program will be displayed near doorways of participating retail food outlets so customers will be able to see just how well restaurants, cafés or other outlets have performed during their food safety inspection.

Participation is voluntary with businesses having the opportunity to promote and advertise their food safety performance.

Keep an eye out for the purple posters on display at some local restaurants and cafés. It's a sign of their participation in the Scores on Doors trial, which is aimed at helping you, the consumer, better understand the standard of food safety in food outlets.

It also gives well-deserved recognition to those businesses with a good food safety record.

Two local businesses participating in this program are Café Sebastion at Ballina Fair and the Coastal Café at Ballina Central.

FREE CHILD RESTRAINT SAFETY CHECKS

Ballina Shire Council, in partnership with Dancers Car Care, a local RTA authorised restraint fitter, is offering \$30 vouchers to local families for a free child restraint safety check or installation.

Parents and carers residing in the Ballina Shire should visit Ballina Shire Council's Customer Service Centre to collect a free voucher to have your child restraint, harness and booster seat checked or installed for free.

Using a correctly fitted and age appropriate restraint greatly increases a child's safety during a crash. A research study, funded by the RTA, has shown that children who are restrained incorrectly are up to seven times more likely to be seriously injured in a crash than children who are restrained correctly.

Residents who are not able to collect the voucher can contact Council's Road Safety Officer on 6686 4444. The child restraint vouchers are valid until Saturday 30 June 2012 and conditions apply.

PROTECT YOUR POOL, PROTECT YOUR KIDS

The warmer weather is here and it is time to check your pool fencing.

Ballina Shire Council, like other local government areas in NSW, requires pools to be fenced to reduce the chances of children drowning.

To comply with NSW laws people need to ensure that:

- Pool fences have no gaps larger than 100mm within or under the fence.
- All gates open outwards, self-close and self-latch.
- The fence is clear of objects such as pot plants, BBQ and furniture because children may use them to climb over.
- Gates or doors are not propped open. Small children are curious.

Responsibilities of pool owners:

- The pool owner is responsible for making sure that their pool is surrounded by a well-maintained child-resistant barrier.
- In rented premises the tenant is responsible for ensuring all gates and doors
 providing access to the pool are securely closed at all times. Landlords
 should be notified immediately of damage or hazards.
- All pool owners must display a prescribed resuscitation chart in a prominent position in the immediate vicinity of the pool. Resuscitation charts can be purchased from Council's Customer Service Centre.

If you are installing a pool or buying a property with a pool it's a good idea to ensure all necessary Council inspections have been undertaken.

Don't forget that pool barriers and warning notices are only part of pool safety; the most important aspect is adult supervision of children in and around swimming pools.

The Samuel Morris Foundation, the Swimming Pool and Spa Association of NSW (SPASA) and the Children's Hospital at Westmead (CHW) have developed the Protect Your Pool, Protect Your Kids video. The video is available on the Children's Hospital at Westmead website, to educate pool owners about pool fencing and common faults.

COMPANION ANIMAL MANAGEMENT PLAN

In July 2010 Ballina Shire Council adopted the

Companion Animals Management Plan. Ballina Shire Council is aware of how important pets are to many people and this plan works with the community to promote responsible dog and cat ownership, and to provide a healthy environment in which animals, their owners and the wider community can comfortably live.

The Management Plan not only outlines off-leash areas for dogs in the shire, it also defines where dogs are not allowed. One prohibited area is the Flat Rock Reef which is exposed at low tide. This reef is an important site for migratory and shore birds.

Off-Leash Dog Exercise Areas

Council recognises the importance of dogs being allowed time to exercise unrestrained and there are six off-leash areas in the shire. Dogs can exercise, roam freely and socialise under the supervision of its owner or person in charge at the following designated off-leash areas:

- Bicentennial Gardens, the northern area of the reserve, Ballina
- Compton Drive, East Ballina
- · Gap Road, Alstonville
- Seven Mile Beach, north of Lake Ainsworth, (old 4WD access point), Lennox Head
- Ballina Heights Estate, eastern reserve area, Ballina Heights
- Headlands Drive Drainage Reserve, Skennars Head

Dog Prohibited Areas

Because of the popularity of some beaches and the presence of migratory and shore birds, dogs are not allowed on:



- Shelly Beach
- Lighthouse Beach
- Seven Mile Beach, south of Lake Ainsworth Reserve (old 4WD access point), Lennox Head
- Flat Rock Reef
- Sharpes Beach (northern end of Sharpes Beach during summer when the beach is patrolled)
- Chickiba Lake (north/eastern corner surrounding the migratory and shore birds roosting area)
- Areas as defined under section 14 of the Companion Animals Act 1998 (NSW).
- And as indicated on Council signage in various areas.

If a person is found to allow their dog in a prohibited area they may be issued with a fine of up to \$330.

KEEPING YOUR POOCH UNDER CONTROL

Most dogs are generally well behaved but there are always exceptions. In the interests of public safety, State legislation mandates that Ballina Shire Council require all dogs in public places to be on an adequate chain, cord or leash that is controlled by a competent person.

If a person is found to allow their dog to be uncontrolled in a public place they may be issued with a fine of up to \$220.

Rangers prefer not to have to issue fines but they do patrol the Ballina Shire and will fine people who are not responsible.


Random Dog Checks

Council Rangers will be increasing their patrols during the summer period particularly of beach areas, undertaking random checks of microchips and registration details of dogs. Penalties will apply for non-compliance.

PICK UP WHAT YOUR DOG DROPS

Failure to clean up after your dog is a constant source of irritation for other members of the community, but it could also mean a fine of \$275. Prevent nutrients entering waterways and reduce the risk of diseases being spread from direct or indirect human contact by picking up after your dog.

OVERGROWN PRIVATE LAND

It's no secret that weeds grow quickly particularly in the summer when it is warm and moist. Quite often weeds grow so quickly they can get out of control.

Land overgrown with weeds and grasses can create a number of hazards in residential and commercial areas and are often breeding areas for rodents such as rats.

It is the responsibility of owners of vacant urban land to keep their properties free of long grass and vegetation.

Council would rather avoid having to be involved with managing overgrown land. It has, however, the responsibility to take action on behalf of complainants when their complaints are justifiable on a public health and safety matter.

Please maintain your land to prevent Council issuing a notice and/or fines.

URBAN 3-BIN WASTE SERVICE

WARM WEATHER HINTS AND TIPS

We are pleased to report that residents have really embraced the new Urban 3-bin waste service. With a low contamination rate and a 43% drop in waste going to landfill we're off to a great start. We hope it will continue through the summer months with the many visitors we expect to join us over the festive summer season.

The organic bins are emptied every week and mixed garbage waste and recycling bins are collected every fortnight.

If household waste is sorted properly, very little organic material should be in your fortnightly mixed waste garbage bin. All organic waste should be placed in your new bin with the green lid, wrapped in newspaper or in a biodegradable bag.

Here are some tips for managing your bins in the warmer weather:

- If possible store bins in the shade and in a wellventilated area.
- Line the bottom of the organics bin with newspaper to prevent food or garden waste sticking to the bin.
- Layer some garden waste over food waste where possible.

- Keep bin lid closed to keep flies out of your bin. If your bin or bin lid is broken phone the Waste Management Centre (02 6686 1287) to have it repaired or replaced.
- Do not overfill the bins.
- Freeze meat and seafood scraps wrapped in newspaper or biodegradable bags and place in the organics bin the night before collection.
- Rinse pet food tins, yoghurt tubs and other recyclable packaging that contain remnants of food waste in left over dishwashing water, before placing into the recycling bin.
- Squash bottles and cans and flatten cardboard boxes and other recyclables to fit more in your recycling bin.
- Rinse polystyrene meat trays and other non-recyclable meat packaging in left over dishwashing water before placing in your mixed waste garbage bin.
- Waste such as nappies and sanitary products can be placed in plastic bags before being put in your fortnightly mixed waste bin.

Welcome to Issue 18 of 'Water Talk'.

Ballina Shire Council's Urban Water Management Strategy currently involves upgrades to two wastewater treatment plants, one in West Ballina and the other in Lennox Head. The upgrades have commenced, with completion planned for late 2012.

With the aim is to reuse 80% of wastewater by the year 2026, the upgraded facilities will allow recycled water to be re-used:

- on urban open space areas eg: parks and playing fields
- in homes with dual reticulation, and
- in vegetation regeneration projects.

The Ballina Wastewater Treatment Plant is currently being decommissioned and demolished, with a new treatment plant being built at the existing site.
